Dear Victoria and Daniel,
As I now live in Bern, I don't often get to the VP productions. However, when I saw that you were putting on the Hobbit, I thought to myself, how on earth are they going to do that and decided to make the effort to find out (last Saturday evening).

The only word I can use to describe what I saw is Extraordinary and I will explain why.

Firstly, your vision and direction of the project is to be congratulated. The ideas worked and the plot came together very well. It could maybe have been cut in one or two places but the conception was very clever. The direction of the scenes was excellent and you really got the most out of your actors. Your control of so many people on a small stage was admirable. I cannot wait to see your next production.

A very special mention for the lighting, properties and effects which were extremely difficult to do and very well managed. The costumes too were very well thought out and made. A magnificent effort.

And now for the leading actors : Chris was a perfect Bilbo and maintained his role throughout with perfect stage presence, voice and body language. A superb performance.

Loïc who played Thorin the leader of the dwarves, gave an absolutely assured and dynamic performance - a natural actor. Wonderful body language and gestures. My only picky suggestions would be that he should have varied the volume of his voice so that when he became angry it would have had more effect. As the role is a big one, the volume and intensity became a bit too much at times.

The idea of having all the dwarves with French accents was excellent with again, the picky point that sometimes we couldn't understand the words ! However, I have rarely seen such wonderful interplay between all the dwarves who never once lost their characters or their interest in what was happening on stage during the many parts where they had little or no dialogue. Wonderful.

I was a little perplexed by John as Gandalf. He gave his usual competent performance though I was not sure what kind of character he was meant to portray. Was he meant to be majestic, funny, humble, self-effacing, magic?

What can I say about Daniel as Gollum? Quite simply, he deserves an Oscar and got a very deserved ovation. He and Chris gave us an unforgettable piece of theatrical joy and lots of shivers of horror. Very very well done. The makeup was splendid too.

The voice and interpretation of Smaug supplied by Heather was really excellent and gave great atmosphere to that scene.

I feel that the two young lady narrators were possibly under-rehearsed. They were charming and played their roles well but the narration was at times too rapid and without much feeling. Maybe they had been told to do it that way.

The Elves, the Trolls and Goblins were enjoyable in super costumes.

I particularly enjoyed the singing - how wonderful to hear unaccompanied singing with beautiful voices so perfectly sung.

How wonderful to see so many young people on stage (and probably back stage) and working so well together. It really was an ensemble production. I do hope to enjoy many more.

Very very many congratulations to you both, all the cast and backstage crew for a very enjoyable evening which no professional company would have been ashamed of. And thanks to the VP committee for supporting this production.

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Hobbit comments from the Front of House Manager

The comments I received every night on Front of House during the intervals and at the end, just as people were leaving, were all about the professionalism of the total presentation; acting, lighting and sound.

Clearly the subliminal effect of the lighting and sound enhanced any weaknesses from the stage and replaced the lack of scenery.

One must not take too lightly the expertise exhibited by the "Dwarves" during their swordplay. A slight miscalculation on their part would have meant a totally different ending to any one of the evenings. I take my hat off to them!

Although some mistakes were made on the first night, they must have been put right, as when word got around about the success of the Hobbit (after the first night!), demands for seating reservations came flooding in...on-line and to my mobile phone.

A total of 404 seats were occupied over the four nights, which is a spectacular success compared to our productions over recent years that brought in thirty to fifty people per performance.

Let us hope that we have more successes like the Hobbit in the future.

In order to survive the Village Players must give more opportunities to the younger generation like the talented Victoria Baumgartner, Daniel Gardini and Chris Hemmens "to do their thing".

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This was a no-holds-barred ambitious production, which really paid off.

The cast were versatile, vigorous, and agile. There was a judicious use of space: movements flowed, fights were realistic, singing created atmosphere, grouped players established scenes of great visual beauty. Great lighting, costumes, technical effects, prodigious make-up all contributed to the cast's expressive performances.

Victoria and Daniel had really polished the details - yet another mark of quality: the gesticulations, the brilliant frightening spider, the rigidified Trolls, the stunning Arahealdis just standing.

A few phrases, a few steps, an innocent smile, a little wave - the Hobbit was out of his hole and among us. Chris Hemmens didn't play Chris Hemmens, he was the Hobbit. This exemplary performance should be kept in mind for all our contributions

to plays or play readings - I hope you agree!

Our audiences have come to the CPO to hear understandable English. The texts didn't always come across. Was this a choice or an accident? Our accents don't matter as long as we are comprehensible.

Thank you for the spectacular evening, an extra Xmas bonus from "a company in the making".



