

The Hobbit is a tale of high adventure, undertaken by a company of dwarves, in search of dragon-guarded gold. A reluctant partner in this perilous quest is Bilbo Baggins, a comfort-loving, unambitious hobbit, who surprises even himself by his resourcefulness and his skill as a burglar.

Encounters with trolls, goblins, dwarves, elves and giant spiders, conversations with the dragon, Smaug the Magnificent, and a rather unwilling presence at the battle of the Five Armies are some of the adventures that befall Bilbo. But there are lighter moments as well: good fellowship, welcome meals, laughter and sona.

Bilbo Baggins has taken his place among the ranks of the immortals of children's fiction. Written for Professor Tolkien's own children, *The Hobbit* met with instant acclaim when published. This adaptation will try to be as truthful to the text as possible, while modernizing the story for today's audience.

TRIESTE, SUNDAY 28 JUNE 1914 - Written and organised by Christa Baan

Chris Hemmens, sporting a new moustache, took on the role of James Joyce. The doctor-playwright Arthur Schnitzler was played by Colin Gamage. Anna "a highly independent and irresistible nurse" who, I was told, was more than a little involved in the life of the Archduke Franz Ferdinand, was played by Christa Baan.

The play setting was in the Café San Marco in Trieste. A very useful Prologue and Epilogue was set in Anna's flat in Vienna in 1947, when she was in her late seventies.

I respect and admire Christa for her passion for theatre She must have spent hours researching, creating and writing the interesting dialogues. Her talent was well served by the cast.

I'm slightly deaf and so "lost" <u>some</u> of the important dialogue. Colin, true to himself, came through. Chris and Christa much less so, despite their visible fine-drawn acting.

Together we must battle against the acoustic conditions at our hired hall. We must make sure that public and players are as near to each other as possible, otherwise how can we expect the public at the back of the hall to hear – and care. Mike Scott.

Much suavity and thinking backed up the frivolity of his witty text. Among others we were introduced to Captain Cook, Goliath, Bogart, Alfred with cakes, Lady Godiva, horse and all.




