For the last month, Salona has been rife with rumours linking Countess Olivia with Duke Orsino.

Her ladyship's steward, Mr Malvolio has taken the rare step of calling a press conference to address this issue.

"Her ladyship Countess Olivia and her brother, Count Stefano have scarcely recovered from the loss of their beloved father. It would obviously be premature for her to launch in a romantic relationship with any other party, however honorable."

"Her Ladyship supposes him virtuous, knows him noble, of great estate, of fresh and stainless youth. In voices well divulged, free, learned and valiant. In dimension and the shape of nature, a gracious person. But she cannot love him"

Mr Malvolio stressed that the media had attempted to profit by spreading "fake" rumours. The press is "the enemy of the Illyrian people" he claimed, going on to single out the representative of the Times of Illyria: "I marvel that the people take delight in such a barren rascal: I saw him put down the other by an ordinary stringer who has no more brain than a stone. Look you now, he's out of his guard already; unless you laugh and admire him, he is gagged."

Mr Malvolio then left without taking questions.

"POT LUCK" PLAYREADING organised by Helen Thrupp

In an impressively efficient display of organisation, the final element of which was necessarily last-minute, depending on the final number and gender of participants, Helen Thrupp plucked from her bag of tricks the first pages of three disparate plays and distributed them at various tables. After a brief period of silent study followed by a lengthy bout of energetic and noisy dialogue, the first resulting interpretations were set before us.

First up was Alan Ayckbourn's 'Season's Greetings,' bitterly funny observations of people who would never choose to see each other, but having to come together for yet another Christmas.

Second was the 1936 story, 'The Women,' by Clare Boothe Luce, an amusing if unflattering depiction of generally unsympathetic women against the background of their class constraints.

The final offering, the 2006 'Ladies' Day' by Amanda Whittington, portrayed women fish packers in Hull (a more agreeable bunch, this), firmly of their class but given the opportunity to rub shoulders with high society when the Ascot Races come to York.

From the angles of both VP theatrical experiment and spectator enjoyment, it has to be voted a success.
