

Village Players' Information (VPI) November 2016

AN EVENING OF SKETCHES - FROM THE AUDIENCE

When I arrived at the CPO for this Club Night, I was looking forward to being, for once, just an ordinary member of the audience. That was until, in the bar, I was cajoled by our Events Coordinator to do this write up "because you're not going to be up on the stage tonight!"

The appeal of comedy is very personal and, fortunately, not everyone is amused by the same things. So this write up is very much my personal observations and comments about this Club Night.

Firstly, I was very pleased to see that this was the best-attended Club Night for quite some time with well over 50 people in the audience. Maybe this tells us something about what attracts people to come to the VPs events -Productions and Club Nights. My view is that people come to be uplifted, entertained and made to laugh and not subject to an evening of dark, morbid subjects. Or being expected to think too deeply to find the meaning behind what they are watching.

A quick glance at the programme showed me that my expectations would have a good chance of being met. It showed an ambitious list of 23 sketches that should cover everybody's tastes. The programme sheet was particularly useful as it informed us that the sketches to be presented covered the period from 1970 - 2015. It also gave the names or sources of the original presentations ranging from Monty Python via Peter Cook/Dudley Moore and The Two Ronnies to Saturday Night Live.

And that these sketches would be performed by a cast total of 17. That's equivalent to 45% of the current VPs membership!

The evening started with the novelty of a loudspeaker announcement with apologies that whoever was taking part would be replaced by someone else - already in the cast list!

The show proper opened with "Hello" a great Peter Cook and Dudley Moore interpretation by Chris and Daniel. A bit later it was good to see our Events Coordinator, Mary, on stage for the first time in the role of a museum curator.

I am attempting not to give a boring write up just listing every sketch that was performed but just give you some of the notes I made as the evening progressed. So I apologise, in advance, to any of the cast whose name or sketch is not mentioned in this write up.

The programme was sourced not only from the UK but some great American (topical) sketches such as "President of China" complete with word play on, among others, Hu (president) and Kofi (coffee) Annan. Then Gwen's tortured English "announcements" really tickled the audience.

It was also very pleasing to see 3 newcomers on the stage for the first time with the VPs. Hopefully this will not be the only time we will be seeing these new members (?) as their they could have so much to give for the future of the VPs.

For example, I found that the two newcomers Kelly and Vivianne in the US sketch "They're Meat" were particularly impressive. Then, not exactly new, newcomers, Julia and Léna demonstrated excellent playing on accents in "Englishwoman in Paris. John Holmes was seen playing his real life role of a schoolmaster in "Prize Poem". It was an excellent performance by John in the Stephen Fry role. I just hope that he is not quite like that when teaching at the ISL!

Chris and Daniel treated us to the superb Two Ronnies sketch of "Mastermind", giving the answers to questions before they are asked. This was an amazing performance of a difficult sketch to perform.

Who was acting "Gerald the Gorilla" from the 1981 Not the 9 o'clock News?

In "Near-death Experience" we saw the talent of the 3 "new to the VPs" on stage together with Cathy in the excellent sketch from the US Saturday Night Live. A translation by Julia of "Die Kuh Elsa" was very well performed by Julia and David. Then Barbara gave a very good imitation of Catherine Tate in "Pub Sketch" with Chris taking the Ronnie Corbett role. Then, I particularly liked the old Ronnie Corbett and Harry Enfield sketch "Blackberry" performed by John and Daniel.

The show closed with a reprise of the Peter Cook and Dudley Moore sketch "The Frog and Peach" performed by the organisers of the evening's magnificent entertainment - Chris and Daniel.

On behalf of all the audience, I say "Many Thanks" to them for putting the show together. Not forgetting all the cast members for giving us a thoroughly challenging and entertaining evening. Colin Gamage.




FUTURE CLUBNIGHTS & EVENTS: N.B. <u>CLUBNIGHTS START AT 19H30</u>
