
Mary asked me to write up my reaction to the evening of short stories for the VPI. « Just a few lines » she added.

In a 'few lines' I can't do justice to such a wealth and variety of writing, let alone the excellent interpretations our various troupers invested in their material.

More difficult for them than taking part in an As You Like It evening because they had to put themselves into characters and language of other ages, culture, morals... in material not of their choosing. Some of them had also done research around the authors.

The pieces ranged from 450 BC to the 20th century - Herodotus to Laurie Lee - authors from France, Italy, Ireland, Greece, India and Germany.







Seeing and hearing VP members draw on all their skills of voice, gesture, and, in some cases, costume, was a joy.

I do not know how many months John Mid took to read, select, and time these pieces, but I do know that his painstaking efforts resulted in success.

I spoke to several members of the audience at the end and they were full of praise for the evening.

One criticism emerged: the casual table seating arrangement meant that some gestures and body language were missed.
